# Commodore's Log

Hi PCYC friends,

2023 was a banner year for PCYC, with lots of action on the water.

As a club, we are growing in the right direction. We have gone from a small club

to a club that is entering its juniors into international competitions. We have also been very happy to see our juniors enter their own teams or be taken on as crew during many of our keelboat regattas held throughout the year.

In the first quarter of 2023, the junior sailing regatta with the Grenada Sailing Association on Grand Anse Beach was the first intra-island competition of the year between participating sailing clubs: Gouyave Sailing School, PCYC and the Woburn Wind Warriors.

Throughout the year, we held three J24 Racing Series events and collaborated with Clarke's Court Boatyard and Marina for an Anniversary Regatta, which included a J24 race day and a 'Race Around Glover Island' to celebrate the marina's anniversary. The event was so successful, we decided to hold a 2nd 'Round Glover Island" Race later in the year.

The Motts Memorial Hobie Cat Racing in July was well attended, followed by the Round Grenada Regatta at the end of August.





The regatta received considerable sponsorship from Budget Marine and Spice Island Marine Services, as well as other smaller sponsors. Las Iguanas in Carriacou and Island Fever Tropical Tavern at Le Phare Bleu Marina put on great parties and despite the light winds, the event saw its highest-ever entries, with 20 boats registered (10 of which were catamarans).

In October, PCYC held another Regatta Weekend to round out the season. The event included the final race day of the J24 Series and another Round Glover Island Offshore Race. The juniors also attended Beach'o'rama in Gouyave at the end of the month, competing against the Gouyave juniors.



Monthly Limes have filled out the club's social calendar, with our Rum Shop Crawl Lime on the magical mystery bus a definite highlight. The Dinghy Poker Runs continue to be a favorite among members and supporters, and the PCYC Christmas Quiz was a festive way to end the season.


















Anita Sutton from PCYC in conversation with Limosa's skipper, Alexia Barrier
